



Know Your Strengths for Better Sand Play

Short Game Advisor





The Pelz Golf Institute has conducted a comparative analysis of professional vs. amateur play from sand. The results paint a vivid picture of where amateurs (at varying handicap levels) are skill-wise compared to the pros, and what they need to do to effectively improve their games.

Working with the PGA Tour ShotLink staff (using their data collection hardware and software), we tracked hundreds of amateurs' play under tournament conditions at the annual golf.com World Amateur Handicap Championship. I'd like to share one aspect of this research with you: how pros deal with greenside sand shots compared to amateurs, and how understanding this difference might help your sand game. The data shows pros leave greenside sand shots, on average, less than 10 feet from the cup (on the green, with a chance for one-putt), while amateurs leave the same shots 19 to 26 feet from the hole, many of which

are in the sand again or in some other kind of trouble.


Pros, like Phil Mickelson, accomplish hitting behind the ball in sand by standing farther behind the ball (positioning the ball farther forward in their stance), while using their normal wedge swing. When you're practicing and working on your sand game, you should use your normal wedge swing as a "reference swing."

Amateurs we have watched do the opposite. They keep the ball in the normal place in their stance, and change their swing to hit behind the ball. This causes awkward swings that have different shapes, speeds and follow-throughs, and yields a variety of inconsistent results.


My suggestion for your future sand play is as follows: from a grassy spot outside the bunker always make a normal wedge swing and note where your divot occurs (somewhere near the center of your stance). Now

assume this same swing will serve as your sand swing. As you step into the sand, position the ball forward in your stance (up at the instep of your front foot) so your same normal divot will start in the sand behind the ball. This will cause your club to hit behind the ball as consistently as you hit normal wedge shots solidly from grass. If you also lay your wedge face open in the sand, the club will scoot under the ball, spinning it up and onto the green. Aim your sand shots to a spot on the green (not necessarily at the flagstick) that leaves you extra space to stay out of trouble. It makes sense that Tour pros aim dead at the flag since they usually hit it to less than 10 feet. When you practice as much as they do, you can aim there, too!

For now, aim to spots that give you more green to work with and take hazards (shotadding situations) out of play. I think it will save you strokes.

Lending to the tour-like feel of these Oceanside layouts is the presence of white jumpsuited forecaddies in every group, a luxury included in nearly every tee time.

The South course features the par 3, 13th hole, which has five tee boxes and two green complexes separated by bunkering and framed by trees.

The club also allows access to a third Fazio-designed venue, the Oak Creek Golf Club.

For those who want to work out the winter moth balls before teeing it up, The Resort at Pelican Hill offers training and lessons at the Pelican Hill Golf Academy. Glenn Deck is a Pelican Hill institution, having been at the resort since its opening two decades ago. He has the perfect teaching for resort guests, offering up simple adjustments that are easy to follow and practice.

Off the course, The Resort at Pelican Hill offers a bevy of accommodation packages for players and non-players alike. On site dining options include the Coliseum Pool & Grill, Pelican Grill, and Andrea. Andrea is the resort's fine Italian dining option, and the chefs leave no stone unturned in bringing you the freshest pasta dishes, with orders coming straight out of a temperature-controlled pasta room. The resort also offers Caffèe in



the main hotel and Caffèe II out on the golf courses. Pelican Hill has a *Forbes* Five-Star spa with 22 private treatment rooms, full salon, and an Acqua Colonnade that provides access to an herbal steam room, sauna, and whirlpool. The colonnade is complimentary to all resort guests and day spa guests receiving spa treatments. Day treatments and retreats change regularly on the season as well.

La Costa Resort and Spa

About 30 minutes up the coast from the Farmers Insurance Open in the foothills of Carlsbad, golfers will find the La Costa Resort and Spa, which is home to the first resort spa in the country, as well as two 18-hole layouts that are welcoming some of the resort's first golfers since a major renovation project overseen by Pascuzzo & Pate Golf Course Design.

The renovation was part of a larger \$50 million project on the property, and every hole on the Champions Course (formerly the North Course) — as well as the opening and closing holes on each nine of the South Course — were touched.

An original Dick Wilson design, the Champions now stretches 7,172 yards from the tips and plays to a par 72. The trio of Damian Pascuzzo, Steve Pate, and Jeff Brauer replaced every green on the Champions, repositioned bunkers and amended the course's grassing to help conserve water. To make the course more attractive to families, "family tees" were added. The addition of the family tees goes along with the designer's mindset of bringing some fun back into the game.

Two examples are the dogleg par 4 9th hole and the short par 4 16th. Heading into the clubhouse, No. 9 lets a player decide how much of the dogleg right they want to bite off by playing the tee shot over a water hazard. The elbow of the fairway is protected by several bunkers in case a player wants to play it safe and straight. The approach is uphill and the green is protected by a bunker, so club selection is key.



The 16th hole is a short, drivable par 4 that is a true risk-reward hole as it measures less than 300 yards from the white tees, just 317 from the blue. The tee shot is visually deceptive, with mature trees framing the trajectory and a water hazard that winds along the tee box, giving the look of a much tighter tee shot than it is. Five bunkers are placed around the fairway and green to collect tee shots, and the green is protected further by a water hazard behind it. A birdie can be had, but the architects really make you think about how to go about carding it.

And if you're looking to see the best of the women's game, the LPGA Tour returns to the LaCosta Resort and Spa from March 19-25 for the Kia Classic. Fans can visit www.kiaclassic. com for tickets and tournament information.

The South is also a Wilson creation, playing to a par 72 at 7,077 yards. A full-service golf academy is also on site to help tune up your game before – or after – you hit the links.


The golf courses weren't the only parts of the resort that have been renovated, as all 611 guest rooms, suites, and luxury villas were touched in 2011. There are four dining options, ranging from fine dining to the new adults-only Diversions Sports Lounge, offering a relaxed setting in which to calculate the low – and high – numbers recorded during the day. The lounge features large televisions to catch up on the day's sports action, as well as offering the ability to wind down even further with views that overlook a pool and the golf courses. A world-class tennis facility is there on site as well for those wishing to get a different kind of swing in. The clay and hard court surfaces have hosted the Women's Professional Tennis Tour. Also on site is The Chopra Center, founded by philosopher and health expert Dr. Deepak Chopra.

The Spa at La Costa features 28,000-square feet of indoor space and a 15,000-square foot outdoor courtyard.

The President, an avid golfer, reenergized the Tour stop long known as the Bob Hope Classic as The Clinton Foundation and Humana signed an eight-year partnership that began this year. While drawing some notable names back to the event, Clinton and Humana seek to encourage and promote healthier living on and off the golf course.



La Quinta Resort features a handful of golfing options for the traveler, beginning with two Pete Dye routes at the resort. Dye, known for major championship venues, created the Mountain Course and the Dunes Course. The Mountain weaves through rock forms that can awe and intimidate, and features elevation changes and pot bunkers that will inspire and challenge. Before teeing off, make sure the camera is as easily accessible as your tees. One of GOLF Magazine's "Top 100 You Can Play," the Mountain tips out at 6,732 yards and plays to a par 72.

The Dunes course is just the opposite, using the mountains as stunning backdrop as you play through palm trees and navigate around bunkers and water hazards. The Dunes plays to 6,712 yards and a par 72 as well.

The resort also includes three championship golf courses at PGA WEST, including the TPC Stadium Course, another Dye creation that hosts the PGA Tour Qualifying School Finals. Jack Nicklaus and Greg Norman have also designed challenging, championship-level layouts at PGA WEST, with Nicklaus' design affording golfers unique decisions off the tee with split fairways. The Golden Bear's layout rewards a player for executing the right tee shots and more aggressive lines.



Training Aid Introduced by Tour's Chip Beck

We've all seen the beer bottle labels where the mountains change colors to indicate coldness. But former PGA Tour star Chip Beck and wife Karen were determined to use that technology to improve golf games. Called Grip Guides, their product is an interactive training aid



that uses thermachromatic technology that combines pressure sensitivity with heat sensitivity. Put more easily, the guide changes color so that golfers can feel, see and check for proper grip position.

Reached in Florida where he showed the new product at the PGA Merchandise Show, Beck said that the concept of Grip Guides came to his wife when she went on an internet search for mood rings—the fad jewelry of the 1970s. "We contacted the same people who invented the mood ring to adapt the technology to golf," Beck said. "A template was developed and Karen's idea worked. There's even a three-dimensional element to it," he added.

Beck's grip is imprinted in thermachromatic ink on adhesive backed material. Pressure-sensitive lines show proper grip alignment and finger position. When a player's hands fold over the grip, he or she sees instantly where they should be.

"Golf Guides are a great tool to teach you how to play," Beck stated. "If your left thumb is in a slightly wrong position, the guide will indicate that a transition just ½" away will give you the best chance at striking the ball squarely."

Ranked among the top 10 players in the world between 1988 - '89. Beck carded four

The Reality of **Belly Putting**

The Scoring Zone



T am already seeing it at the dome in Buffalo ■Grove where my staff and I teach during the winter months. There is an indoor green that gets a lot of use. I see more and more belly putters, which could be a good thing, except it's not. I understand what is happening. Amateurs are seeing players on tour, such as Webb Simpson, Bill Hass, Keegan Bradley, and so many more converting to belly putters and thinking that belly putting will help them. Off to the store they go and off the shelf they buy. For probably about 95 out of 100 players, they just wasted their money and, more importantly, their time.

Because a belly putter is anchored to the body, a player really can't self- correct if the path or the face of the putter is out of position during the back stroke. If it's in the right position, that's a good thing. If it's out of place, it's a bad thing. When a belly putter is too long it will hit the player too high, forcing them to set up too tall with their hands outside of their shoulder line. When a player sets up in that position, they will fight the putter com-

ing inside too much with the face opening to the intended target.

When a belly putter is too short, a player will be forced to tilt over too far with the belly putter contacting the player too low resulting in the hands aligning inside of the shoulder line. That set up will typically result in the shoulders tipping and the putter moving outside of the intended target line.

If the putter head is out of position in relation to the target, then the player's ability to recover and manipulate the putter is greatly reduced when it is attached to the player's belly. That is why belly putting can potentially hurt as much as it could help a player.


Another mistake I see is that players think a belly putter length should be based on height. Taller players think they need a longer belly putter.


For example, I recently fit a junior player who was 5' 7". He had fairly long legs for his height and measured out to a 33" conventional length putter. He was very slender so it took 91/2" to connect to his body when he set up properly with a belly putter. He needed a 42½" belly putter. A few weeks later I fit a man who was 6' 4" to a conventional putter length of 36". He was barrel-chested and it only took 6" to complete the distance to his belly. He needed a 42" belly putter. Who would have thought that the kid who was 5′ 7″ would need a longer belly putter than the man who was 6' 4"? Truthfully, not me until I had that experience.


Bottom line is that belly putters work amazingly well, but they have to be precisely fit to a player once they have learned the proper set up position. Don't waste your time and money buying a belly putter off the shelf without professional help. It makes about as much sense as buying prescription glasses or contacts without the right prescription.

The GOLF Chicago Interview

or a man who strives for balance in his life, Luke Donald endured a dizzying four days in November.


His father, Colin, died suddenly near London while Luke was awaiting the birth of his second child at his North Shore home. Family members advised him to stay in Chicago, and he was rewarded with an early-morning gift on 11/11/11 – a second daughter, Sophia.

"Dad was certainly a free spirit and had his own ways," Donald said. "He was very proud of my golf achievements but more proud of the person I've turned into. He brought me up to lead a very balanced life."

Donald's golf game reflects that steady approach. The Northwestern alum consistently dominated, becoming the first golfer to win both the PGA Tour and European Tour money titles. He went 449 consecutive holes without a three-putt.

He enters his first PGA Tour event of 2012 – the AT&T Pebble Beach National Pro-Am, which begins Thursday – with a sizable lead in the world rankings. (He has 9.59 average points to Rory McIlroy's 7.86 and Lee Westwood's 7.54.)

Donald addressed many topics in this telephone interview.





Chicago Tribune: Elle has been good luck for you. Is there now pressure on Sophia?

Donald: Of course. I don't think it's a coincidence that my golf game has gotten better since the birth of Elle (in February of 2010). It has given me better balance and perspective, so it's easy to let those bad rounds and bad shots go.

CT: I thought we could attribute your rise to No. 1 to having teed it up with me in April of 2009 for my "18 holes with ..." column?

Donald: Are you sure? You might be mistaken. I probably a missed the cut the next week. [Donald tied for 37th at the Players Championship.]

CT: Does Elle swing a plastic club? Donald: Occasionally, mainly one-handed. She could be a lefty; who knows? If she wants to pursue it further, she will. But I won't be one of those pushy parents.

CT: Have you splurged on anything with all that cash?

Donald: We went on a nice holiday to Barbados. But I don't know, I'm not a splurger. I guess the biggest splurge was buying a lot in the Bear's Club (in Jupiter, Florida). But when the kids get old enough, we'll spend more time in Chicago. I understand the schools are better there.

CT: Why keep spending so much time in our beloved but cold-weather city? Donald: Chicago is fun. We've spent a lot of time there, about 15 years. My wife's parents and family live in Chicago, so that's a big selling point.

Diane's mother is great in terms of coming around to look after the kids.

CT: Your home club in Chicago, Conway Farms, has unofficially been awarded the 2013 BMW Championship. Your thoughts? Donald: I'm excited for a lot of the pros to see the course. A few have played it already and have good memories. I have talked to the GM, Todd Marsh, and (Director of Golf) Jeff Mory and shared thoughts on improving the course. I think it's exciting to have a tour course at a place where you are a member. It's certainly a lot shorter drive for me than going to Cog Hill (in Lemont). The biggest problem I'll have is turning the pros away who want to stay with me.

CT: Who would you consider letting crash at your place?
Donald: Whoever is willing to pay!
Rent's expensive out there.

CT: Which players are you tightest with? Donald: Sergio [Garcia]. I've known him since the beginning. Tim Clark. Nick Watney. And guys from the Bears Club. Carl Pettersson, Tom Gillis, Camilo [Villegas], Ernie [Els].

CT: Now that you are the most powerful man in golf, what is next on your agenda?

Donald: Continue to improve. That's always my goal. Give myself lots of chance to win tournaments.

CT: How about eradicating slow play? You tweeted (@LukeDonald) that it is "killing our sport."

Donald: All I can do is raise the issue. The speed of play will only be



improved only if all the players take responsibility when it's their turn to [hit]. That's doubtful.

CT: How do you close the gap between the ability to win tournaments and the ability to win majors?

Donald: My golf game is good enough to win majors right now, it just hasn't happened. It hasn't been the right time. There are things I can improve, like driving. I improved a lot [in that area] last year but still have more to go. If I can get the ball in the fairway more often, I'll have better opportunities.

CT: Which major venue gives you the best chance this year (Augusta, The Olympic Club, Royal Lytham & St Annes, Kiawah Island)?

Donald: Probably Augusta, because of experience. You often see lot of great winners there, and it favors someone with a proficient short game. I've never played The Olympic Club. I have played Lytham, but only some amateur events. I haven't played Kiawah.

CT: Is the Ryder Cup at Medinah already on your brain?

Donald: Certainly I'd like to be on that [European] team. I wouldn't want to miss it for anything.

CT: Are you expecting lots of ticket requests?

Donald: Yes, I think it's a little like Augusta. They're pretty frugal. You get eight for the week and I think you have an option to purchase four more.

CT: If a teammate asks for a restaurant suggestion, which would you give him?

Donald: You can't go wrong with Japonais or anywhere where my wine

is sold. Gibsons is a good spot for people watching and steak. If you're more of a gourmet, you can try to get into Next or Alinea. Or find some good pizza at Gino's East.

CT: What's longest stretch you went this winter without hitting a ball? Donald: Three weeks. Last year it was five weeks. You need it after playing both tours.

CT: When was the last time you checked the standings of the World Rankings? Donald: Probably last week. There are always people on your heels. I'm more checking on other people. It's something to pass the time.

CT: What's the coolest thing about being the world's No. 1?

Donald: To know that your best is good enough to beat anyone in the world.

CT: Your run of 449 holes without a three-putt ended at the Dunhill Links. How did you react?

Donald: Lwas approved Lagrinded over

Donald: I was annoyed. I grinded over that 8-footer and it lipped out.


CT: You left yourself an 8-footer? Donald: The first putt was from 80-100 feet.

CT: What's a simple tip for the weekend hacker that will generate positive results quickly?

Donald: Work on your short game.





Preseason Improvements with Stability and Mobility

he Chicago Golf Show is an annual **L** tradition that gives Windy City golfers hope that the days of greener fairways are approaching. In just a few more weeks, we will be playing the greatest game in the world. Will you be ready? There is a lot of information to help you improve; however, swing fixes and fitness tips are usually very generalized at addressing an individual's issues. Where do you start?

At Kinetic Performance Center, we think of the golf swing differently. We believe that there is an intimate thread that connects an individual's swing with an individual's physical limitations. Stability and mobility are critical elements for playing good golf. By stability we mean your ability to remain unchanged and apply opposing force while something is moving

against it (applied strength). By mobility we mean you have the ability to move freely in a given position.

Unfortunately, we see the following statistics from new clients:

64% of golfers lose posture throughout the golf swing.

44% of golfers have an "over-the-top" swing path.

38% of golfers produce a reverse spine angle during their backswing.

34% of golfers sway and slide.

Not only do these issues cause life-long frustration, these concerns also expose you to a serious risk of injury. The great news is that if you address the stability of your body and your mobility routine (stretching), then you will be well on your way to creating a platform to eliminating your swing faults.

Here is a great training exercise you can do not only in the coming weeks, but also throughout the season to improve stability and mobility with your golf swing.

Equipment needed: Swiss ball and FMT tension tubing

With the tubing attached chest high, narrow your base of support on the ball with the bottom of both feet flat to the ground. While in good posture, start pulling. When you get comfortable, go ahead and raise one leg while remaining in good posture. This will force you to stabilize you lower body while increasing the mobility in your upper body.



DEANE BEMAN GOLF'S DRIVING FORCE

Deane Beman: Golf's Driving Force



an you name the man who had a coup Ud'état staged against him by Jack Nicklaus and Arnold Palmer? The outcome of that rebellion changed the face of professional golf. The man who went headto-head with two of golf's demigods was Deane Beman. Prior to Beman becoming commissioner of the PGA Tour, professional golf was an arm of the PGA of America and the Tour had the foresight of a mayfly. From 1974 to 1994, Beman built a brand that has become a billion dollar enterprise.

Beman came into the Tour's office after a steady yet unremarkable professional playing career. His runner-up at the 1969 U.S. Open and four career PGA Tour victories pale when compared to his accomplishments as the Tour's commissioner: creation of the Tour's tax-exempt status (resulting in 1.6 billion dollars for charities and organizations); development of the TPC network of golf clubs; initiation of a development tour, and presentation of a product to the world that created bidding wars between the television networks. If there is one man to thank for the PGA Tour becoming an international commodity, his name is Deane Beman.

Deane Beman: Golf's Driving Force has already earned a place among golf's indispensable biographies; moreover, Deane Beman: Golf's Driving Force is a timeline explaining how the game we watch today became one of the majors in terms of professional sports. Award-winning journalist Alan Schupak's research and interviews with over 200 prominent individuals in the golf world are in fact the tome for the history of professional golf from 1974 to the Tiger Woods era. As a senior writer for Golfweek, Schupak's connections give him access to golf's "A" list. As a result, Schupak delivers candid, primary source reporting on the events and behind the scenes drama, which make up the most exciting two decades in the Tour's history.





Justin Time

ustin Vineyards and Winery is located in Paso Robles in California's Central Coast region. William Randolph Hearst's famous "castle," San Simeon, is due west over the Sierra Madre mountains.

Justin was founded in 1981 by Justin Baldwin when he planted the 160 acre property with the major grapes of Bordeaux, and the emphasis on Bordeaux-style blends and single varietals remains to this day. In addition to the estate vineyard, Justin sources grapes from thirteen affiliated growers in the area.

The winery's three prime areas of focus are: a "left bank" Bordeaux-style blend of Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot and Cabernet Franc, named Isosceles, Justin's flagship and most well-known offering; Justification, it's "right bank" Merlot and Cabernet Franc cousin; and varietal bottlings of Cabernet Sauvignon and Syrah. They also produce limited amounts of Tempranillo, Zinfandel, Malbec, Petit Verdot, Port, Sauvignon Blanc, Chardonnay, and Viognier.

For these varietals, each year Justin commissions a different artist to execute the art portion of the label. The winery buildings and their surrounding vineyards are always the subject matter, the idea being that the artists' interpretation of the winery is like the winemaker's interpretation of the vineyard's grapes.

In addition to the tasting room, there is also an inn and restaurant on the property. \$14

The nose offers aromas of fresh peach, citrus notes dominated by ruby grapefruit, and a hint

On the palate the wine is dry, with bright acidity, and some of the peach flavor carries over from the nose. The body has very good structure for a sauvignon blanc.

Although we can't complain much about this mild winter, an even nicer spring is coming, so get ready to pair this wine with Rosemary-Lemon Chicken, Crab and Shrimp Etouffee, or Broiled Scallops.

2009 Cabernet Sauvignon

\$26 After a balanced growing season and unchallenging harvest, Justin's '09 cabernet was matured for 16 months in French and American oak, 33% of it new.

In the glass, this wine is a not-quite opaque ruby red. It features aromas of black fruits, with a vanilla note from the oak. Surprisingly, there were almost no legs.

Its taste offers up red and black cherries and red currents, although the fruit is somewhat recessive, and is reflective of Justin's preference for an old-world style, rather than what one might usually expect from the Central Coast. The wine is nicely tannic, with a medium finish.

This food-friendly wine would work well with Yankee Pot Roast, Creole Pork Chops, or Chicken Cacciatore.

Graham's Quinta Dos Malvedos 2009 Vintage Porto [\$55]

In the Douro valley of Portugal, home of true Port wines, only the finest years are declared as Vintages, the best of the best. The last declared vintage was 2007.

However, the grapes grow every year, of course, and the foremost houses still have a high-quality product to offer even in non-declared years. This is usually released as a single quinta [Portugese for farm, but understood as vineyard or estate] bottling. These wines also receive a vintage designation, rather than being used for more anonymous blended ports.

Graham's Quinta dos Malvedos is just such a product, a ruby port expressing Graham's finest efforts of 2009. This wine has seen two years in barrel, and although I'm sure it will age well, I suggest drinking it now. The wine is delightfully approachable, with none of the aggressive characteristics so often seen in a young Vintage Port.

The alcohol, tannins, and fruit are nicely balanced, with the palate displaying the classic port flavors of cassis and blackberries.

Enjoy this wine either as an aperitif or with dessert (blue cheese and walnuts are traditional, but chocolate mousse would be delicious as well). And, please forgo fussy liqueur glasses or port "pipes;" a white wine glass will do just fine.

Wherefore Art Thou...Golf?

en years ago the summer calendar in Illinois included two PGA and LPGA Tour events as well as Nationwide and Champions Tour tournaments.

As we peel the shrink-wrap off 2012, all that's left is the John Deere Classic in Silvis, Illinois. Of course, the Ryder Cup comes to the state for the first time in September at Medinah Country Club, but the dearth of annual events is troubling.

PGA Tour veteran and Winfield native Kevin Streelman said it best: "Going forward, it's kind of a bummer."

Fortunately several championships are within driving distance, beginning with the Senior PGA Championship at The Golf Club at Harbor Shores in Benton Harbor, Michigan, the week of May 22-27, followed by the U.S. Women's Open at Blackwolf Run in Sheboygan, Wisconsin, July 5-8. The BMW Championship will be held at Crooked Stick on September 3-9 in Carmel, Indiana.

Watching Steve Stricker go for four straight at the JDC will be fun, and in a Ryder Cup year that tournament will mean more to American players (paging Kenny Perry), but Chicago-area fans shouldn't have to drive hours in any direction to see a professional tournament.

"It's disappointing," Streelman said. "[Chicago] is such a great, especially public, golf town with such great courses."

When it comes to the barren landscape of professional golf in this state, the simple question is "Why?" The answers are far from simple, however.

There are plenty of tour-quality golf courses here, most of which are private. To this point, those memberships haven't wanted to give up their club on an annual basis. More importantly, there hasn't been a sponsor willing to take advantage of the third largest market in the country. To that end, how hard are any of these tours actually working to bring an annual event back to the Windy City?

"It's all part of the deal. That's the way it's always been," Streelman said. "You've got to have that relationship between the tour, the city, and the corporate sponsor, and it's got to be a nice, synergistic relationship."

If you think about it though, the lack of golf here isn't that surprising. The move of the former Western Open to September proved you absolutely cannot put golf up against the start of school and football. You also can't have a tournament here until June at the earliest.

That leaves a three-month window to hold an event, and asking a course to seriously limit and then stop play during its prime earning season is tough. Over the years, the Jemsek family has been the only course owner willing to do so, and look what they got in return.

A less talked about factor in all this may be that in the Chicago area, the Fourth Estate has been decimated. The average fan may not care about media coverage, but the sponsors and the tours do. The newspapers in and around Chicago just don't cover golf like they used to. It's also an afterthought for radio and television during baseball season, a Bulls or Blackhawks playoff run, or Bears training camp.

Chicago may be the third largest market in the country but when it comes to the way the tours view us; it feels a lot like Smallville.


• The USGA and the R&A loosened the Windsor knot a bit this off-season, changing three ridiculous rules to allow the game to be played with, well, common sense. The biggest change you'll hear about is to Rule 18-2b, where if the ball moves after address (oftentimes on greens) the player isn't penalized and the ball can be played from its new position. Rule 13-4 was changed to let a player smooth out sand or dirt in a hazard at any time, as long as it's not improving stance, swing, or line of play. The last rule change should make Jim Furyk happy – if a player misses his or her tee time within five minutes, it's a two-stroke penalty rather

• World No. 1 Luke Donald has been a breath of fresh air since ascending to golf's top spot in that he's not afraid to use his status to deliver some messages – unlike the last long-running top dog, er, cat. The Englishman has taken on slow play, pushed for the BMW Championship at his home club at Conway Farms, and poked at the PGA Tour for suddenly withholding its 2011 Player of the Year ballots last fall.

I talked with Donald about this during an event at Cress Creek Country Club in Naperville back in October.

"I think with that number one ranking comes a lot more responsibility, a lot more media requests, a lot more time commitments and I have to be a little bit more careful with what I say," he said with a chuckle. "I think that's a responsibility [being No.1] brings and fortunately I've been able to deal with it pretty well. I haven't let those distractions affect me on the golf course."
